## **Tutor Tips**By Barbara Heuer

As we move to a different pace and schedule for the summer, we want to thank you for your conscientious tutoring and the care you put into our "studentcentered" LVWC.

In past columns we've reminded you of research-tested strategies that enhance your tutoring, like listening actively to your student and noticing body language; embracing silent pauses as your student composes her responses; and like encouraging repetition and practice.

In this last tutor tips column of this school year, I want to consider the trajectory (or lack thereof) of your tutoring this year. Rather than offering tips to use in your individual sessions with your student, I suggest you step back and reflect to see any patterns in your student's literacy learning. (Obviously, this will not fit every tutor's situation, but take what you will.)

Last week at my granddaughter's high school graduation (!), the commencement speaker outlined his very non-linear, uneven path to success. His message to the

graduates was that it took many personal, professional, and educational missteps to arrive at his present well-being.
But he did.

Theresa and I have had tutors tell us they worry when their student doesn't seem to be making any progress, doesn't remember vocabulary words or correct pronunciation or last week's topic. This frustration is understandable. As you know so well, the road to literacy is not a direct route from a to z, heck, it may not even be paved (sorry!). It may be filled with u-turns, detours, traffic, breakdowns, accidents, etc. (sorry again!). And the destination may keep moving!

This (too corny?) metaphor applies to the adult learner's journey. It makes even more sense when we remember multi-layered factors that affect your adult student's learning: past education and experiences; learning styles; cultural and social influences; work and family obligations; and readiness. Hopefully, you consider these movable parts in your student and in yourself when you tutor.

We are here to support you...over the bumps and byways (stop me!). We believe our individualized tutoring program and your flexibility, patience and trustin-the-process are the keys to success. Thank you. Please keep your questions and ideas coming.
